Booking Procedure

- You must book in advance to attend any Sunday Services using the links at www.ChristChurchLanark.com
- You will not need to book to attend Wednesday Services, which will start from Wednesday 12th May at 11:30am.
- Choose the number of virtual 'Tickets' you need based on how many people from your household will attend.
- The booking system will stop working when a service is fully booked. Please try another service if this occurs.
- If you think you will be unable to attend after booking, please let Lee know by each Friday at 5pm, so that others may use your slot.
- If you are aware of anyone struggling to book a place, you may book tickets on their behalf online using their name.
- If you are still unable to use the online system, you can phone Lee at 0141 772 8176 on any day apart from Saturday (day off) to discuss booking.
- By booking and attending, you give your consent to us holding your contact details for 21 days and passing them on to NHS Test & Protect should anyone later test positive for Coronavirus.
- If you have any symptoms of Coronavirus (cough, change in taste/smell, temperature) then please inform the NHS and do not attend the service.

Booking Arrangements for Services

Dear Christ Church,

I write to inform you of some exciting upcoming changes to services and booking arrangements at Christ Church.

Sundays - from 9th May

To meet increased demand on Sundays we'll add an additional Sunday Service at 9:30am starting 9th May. The normal service will move from 11am to 11:30am - to allow cleaning time.

It is hoped having two Sunday Services will mean everyone can get a seat every week.

Until Sunday 9th of May, there will still only be one Sunday Service at 11am which must be booked for in advance.

Wednesdays - from May 12th

Starting Wednesday 12th May there will be a Service each week at 11:30am. There will be no service on Wednesdays until 12th May.

Since we don't expect maximum numbers there will be no booking needed for attending Wednesdays. We'll simply take a note of your names each Wednesday at the door.

All three services will be the same and we want to allow everybody to attend, therefore please attend only one out of three services per week.

I hope that's everything, but if you have any further questions - don't hesitate to be in touch.

Teas and Coffees

Starting Sunday 9th of May we'll be able to meet in the hall over tea and coffee after the 11:30am Service, subject to the laws around indoor hospitality. **Up to six people from two households** will be able to sit together in groups and socialise. Masks must be worn when you enter the hall until you are seated then tea and coffee will be served at the tables. Socialising more widely by moving between tables won't be possible and social distancing must be maintained between households. Although this is still far from normal, we soon hope that these restrictions will gradually ease.

Clergy Cogitations

Dear Friends,

Just as sure as the seasons change, so too do things in the church. As lockdown eases and life begins to return to something a little closer to normality we are developing some new strategies at Christ Church to cater for our changed circumstances and to keep our mission and ministry both on track and up to date.

PATTERN OF SERVICES

As it is now safe to do so, we would like to encourage ALL of you to return to Christ Church in person. To facilitate this we are increasing the number of services we offer in the building. These will be:



Sundays 9.30 am (online booking required) 11.30 am (online booking required)

Wednesdays 11.30 am (no online booking required)

The first Sunday with this pattern will be the 9th May; the first Wednesday will be the 12th May. On Sundays the Church building will be deep cleaned between services. It will receive similar treatment between the Sunday and Wednesday celebrations. Please only attend one of the services on offer each week. This will ensure that everyone gets a chance to be in church. The same sermon, prayers and music will feature on all three occasions.

ONLINE MEETINGS

The pattern of fortnightly zoom gatherings on Tuesdays and Thursdays will continue. Tuesday zooms at 2 pm will be a variety of worship, talks/ presentations and social events (quizzes etc). Thursday zooms at 7.30 pm will be a study group forum for discussion and discipleship. If you are not receiving the weekly links for these online meetings please contact Lee (l.johnston.gla@ gmail.com). He will add you to his mailing list.

Given the high demand for in person services we will be paring back our own service recordings (which can take up to three days to prepare, shoot, edit and upload). In their place we will be highlighting the Scottish Episcopal Church's national recordings and those of the Church of England. These are services which will allow you to sing along to your favourite hymns at home in a way that we are currently unable to do due to copyright restrictions.

PREACHING TEAM

With the looming prospect of our Curate Lee's departure to pastures new we are discerning and recognising the wealth of gifts among our number. To that end we are exploring the possible creation of a new team of preachers and worship leaders to assist Drew in enriching the congregation's experience of worship post Lee's curacy. Those of you who accessed the written reflections that we made available to you in written and digital form during Holy Week will already have benefitted from their prayerful and reflective perspectives. More details of the team will appear later in this magazine.

Over the last year the only constant has been change. As things have changed, however, God has enabled us to continue our life of worship and care and even to grow both numerically and spiritually. With that conviction in mind let us move forward into another new phase full of faith, hope, love and the excitement that comes from being a follower of Christ, a pilgrim on the way.

Vestry Business



We are delighted to inform you of three Vestry initiatives that, we hope, are going to boost our ministry and mission no end.

HALL KITCHEN & TOILETS UPGRADE

For many years now the kitchen and toilet facilities in the hall have been needing serious attention. Until lockdown our hall was used all day, every day by ourselves and by a variety of other groups and organisations. After receiving a very generous donation from Yvonne and John Cannon for the purchase of a new cooker the thought took root that this might be the time to consider a complete revamp of the kitchen, as well as a very necessary makeover of the cubicle toilets, where damp has caused a lot of damage to the lower parts of the walls. A team has been set up to take this forward. Watch this space for further updates and information.

NEW LIGHTING SCHEME FOR THE CHURCH

During the time of Dan Gafvert's incumbency a number of IKEA standard lamps were purchased and installed along the interior walls of the church. The idea behind these was to enable worship of a more creative kind to take place. All of the standard lamps are now past their sell buy date, as are the other spots onto the chancel and altar areas and the main lights above the nave. Vestry has decided it is time to look at other possibilities. As with the kitchen upgrade a team consisting of vestry members and people with electrical expertise in the congregation has been put together with a view to making this exciting project happen. Again, watch this space for further updates and information.

APPLICATION TO THE DIOCESAN RECOVERY & RENEWAL FUND

The Diocese has made available to congregations funds to help them cope with the new demands of digital ministry and mission in these times of pandemic. At Christ Church we will be filing an application to access some of these funds in the next week or so. While we are encouraging everyone to return to "live" church by providing extra slots on Sundays and in the middle of the week it cannot be guaranteed that "live" church will pertain without further spikes and lockdowns in the future. To that end we need to ensure that our technical provision for the production of online videos of worship is as up to date as it possibly can be. As the equipment we are using just now is basic to say the least, we shall be applying for funds to purchase a "teleprompter" (which will enable us to speak directly to camera and give our films a more professional finish), a large, standing "tripod" (which will make the positioning of cameras much easier) and a "lighting deck" (which will help to remove the bags under the Rector's eyes and give his grey hair a dazzling white sheen!)

We trust these projects meet with your approval and look forward to feeling the benefits of them in the months and years that lie ahead.
